#### From our CEO:

Dear Friends,

It is hard to believe that the festive season and year end is almost upon us. While the team are busy preparing gifts and special events for women we walk alongside – it is also a time to pause and reflect on the year that has been.

Since our May newsletter, demand for our service has remained high – with an average of 40-50 women supported by Karinya House at any one time. We were also delighted to see several women at Karinya House recently allocated public housing. While moving out is a bittersweet moment for women and our staff, we take great pleasure in seeing a woman take the next step in her journey and her independence. One woman sent us a proud photo of herself outside her new family home and

said "Karinya is the family I never had".

Having spent most of my career overseas prior to Karinya House, I have been humbled by the strength of the Canberra village that surrounds Karinya House. I have seen this village in action over the last sixmonths. From our dedicated staff and volunteers, through to the individual, government, corporate and community partners that donate to or fund Karinya House. From connecting a woman's television in her new house, to donating books for our new library, or dressing up as "Santa" for the women's Christmas party – I see these acts of recognition and respect from our staff, volunteers and supporters every day at Karinya House.

In addition to meeting our village of supporters, the past six months have also seen our Executive Team focus more intentionally on workforce planning and development. With a number of new staff joining us, we have spent time reaffirming the culture and values of Karinya House, as well as building greater connections between our volunteers and staff. Our new Workforce Plan reflects this, as well as other actions to promote diversity, retention and recognition of staff and volunteers.

September was also a significant month for fundraising, with the success of our Gala Dinner on Friday 8 September and annual Double Up Appeal. This period also saw us bring an additional resource onboard, focused on fundraising and events, and the establishment of several new corporate partnerships.

A most significant event occurred at Karinya House on Tuesday, 24 October 2023. We were thankful to welcome Selina Walker, local emerging elder, accompanied by her Aunty Annette Shea, to Karinya House for Welcome to Country and Smoking Ceremony.

This was a very special time, both from a physical and healing perspective. The ceremony was

attended by current residents, their babies and children, Karinya volunteers, Committee and staff. Selina spent time welcoming us, taking the smoke through all buildings, including residences, and sharing learnings with us about the smoking and how we can take these learnings with us into our lives.

Thank you, Selina and Aunty Annette, for being with us and for the gift of Welcome and Cleansing.

As part of the introduction to the Smoking Ceremony, Services Director, Belinda Munn noted "Now more than ever we need to work together to ensure that our Acknowledgement of Country is more than words. Collectively and individually, we need to put this respect and acknowledgement into action every day, in whatever way we can. We must speak and act to ensure that the sovereignty of this country's First Nations People is recognised, valued, learned from and respected."


### Lil' Village Library
